


PROGRAMME functions as recipient who completes the work, interpreting the object and provides its context and meaning in relation to the other things within the gallery space. The recepients specific understanding, knowledge and desire is the most important ingredient. It isnt so much the presence of the sofa, but the possibility to position it in different contexts; the relation between placing and meaning, form and sense. With every recepient there is another vision and different styles incorporate and create interactive conditions and open new territories of discourse, exchange new information. I hope loads of people will feel that they want to sit on the sofa; it is essential to confront the audience with a new staging: to encourage irrationality and uncertainty, to stimulate that which is absent, nameless; the process of imagination and concentration.

Moving On B+B are holding a discussion at the

Whitechapel on Saturday 3rd March at 2pm. The open discussion aims to take Belt at Temporary Accommodation as a starting point for looking at the wider picture of current 'collective' art practices. Come and contribute ideas, attitudes, examples and material so we can move on from this Temporary Accommodation. 'Moving On' is the first B+B stopover, B+B (Sarah Carrington and Sophie Hope) is pursuing an enquiry into current artistic practices that focus on discussion and exchange as the catalyst for socio-political intervention. This practice is often durational with a specific engagement often removed from any notion of a fixed location......Our line of enquiry is twofold: firstly identifying artist's motivations and secondly engaging with collective experience. Interviews will raise issues that will then be articulated to a wider. audience through a series of open conversations or 'stopovers'. A small ongoing publication will relay the results of our enquiry. This process will hopefully create a situation in which the aims of the practice and the effects and interpretations of the participants will actively feed in and out of one another. Our aim is to instigate debate and share ideas/issues that have been raised from artists working with people. B+B hopes to offer timeout to reflect, locate and focus on current practices. # \* A CREATIVE EXPERIMENT IN MIXED MODALITY COLLABORATION \*

Welcome to KnoWhere .... .....an intersubjective, otherworldly, off-shore echo.

We know its still out there.... in the life-world. But as artifacts flow through a kind of afterimage, we find ourselves transported somewhere else. Our minds are action.

This project was initiated by London Fieldworks to investigate the human experience of light and landscape through perception, memory and the use of technology. A programme of theoretical and practical workshops has drawn together a group of artists with varying degrees of visual ability, with specialists from the fields of performance, glass making, electronics, electrotextiles, biofeedback, sound and web design. A fieldtrip to a remote offshore location in early January 2001 resulted in the generation of material and data. This raw material has been developed collaboratively within the group. Video works, an interactive sculpture, live sound and music, spoken word. performance and web site are presented as the co-ordinates of 3KnoWhere2. For information about presentations:
