This work centres on three generations of family albums, the quantity and ambiguity of pictures in contrast with the sparsity of information. The idea of addressing a specific audience is implicit in family photo albums, as is an unashamed subjectivity. Images are emptied of their history over time. A handful of relatives might be able to 'read' the images. The use of digital imaging and video editing emphasises the ease at which facts sink like stones. This work was

sparked off by the Manchester family portraits that share Anna Best's grandmother's name – Montagu, which roughly translates as *Steep Mountain*.

Anna Best (based in London) has developed a process-based practice based on an investigation into the local and specific, into narrative structures and working with other people.
